This information is needed for inclusion in a term paper due August 9, 1967. The class is studying Anglo-American Geography. This writer has been assigned "Land Uses On The Yakima Indian Reservation - Then and Now" as the subject for study and report.

An introductory chapter covering a cursory view of Indian History leading up to formation of the reservation has been written.
