Last Will and Testament

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that I, ABIGAIL HARDER, of Green Bay, Wisconsin, being of sound and disposing mind and memory and mindful of the uncertainties of human life, do hereby make, publish and declare this my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills and codicils thereto by me made, as follows, to wit:

I. It is my wish and I hereby direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid out of my estate.

II. I hereby give and bequeath unto First Church of Christ, Scientist, of Green Bay, Wisconsin, the sum of Two thousand (2000) dollars.

III. Having provided for perpetual care of my lot in Woodlawn Cemetery, in Green Bay, Wisconsin, being the lot in which my deceased husband is buried, I desire nevertheless that a sufficient sum be set aside out of my estate to purchase and erect headstones on my grave and on the grave of my husband, such stones to be similar to or at least as good as the headstones on the Thrall lot in said cemetery.

IV. I hereby give and bequeath to my sister, Eleanora Barnes, of Green Bay, Wisconsin, the sum of Five hundred (500) dollars in cash or its equivalent.

V. I hereby give and bequeath to my brother, Gaylord Barnes, of California, the sum of Eight hundred (800) dollars in cash or its equivalent.

VI. I hereby give and bequeath to my niece Ollie Burlingame, of Yakima, Washington, the sum of One thousand (1000) dollars, in cash or its equivalent, in token of the excellent care she gave to her sisters Grace and Zada.

VII. I hereby give and bequeath to my nephew Bert Whitmore, of California, the sum of Fourteen hundred (1400) dollars, in cash or its equivalent.

IX. I hereby give and bequeath to COMMITTEE LUTHERAN OF MILWAUKEE

XV. I hereby give and bequeath to Mrs. Emma Shepard and Mrs. Sarah Martin all my Science and other books and literature, and, after the death of Captain P.F. Thrall, such of my household furniture as they may select.

XVI. All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, if any there be, I hereby give, devise and bequeath unto my brother, Gaylord Barnes, my nephews, Bert Whitmore and Rolland Whitmore, and First Church of Christ, Scientist, of Green Bay, Wisconsin, equally, share and share alike.

XVII. I hereby nominate and appoint B.L. Parker of Green Bay, Wisconsin, and Mrs. Marian Jackson of De Pere, Wisconsin, the executors of this will, and request that they be not required to furnish any bond as such.

And I hereby confer upon the said executors full power and authority to take, handle, manage and control my said estate; to sell, convey, invest, reinvest, release, assign, convert and reconvert my said property the same as I might or could do if living.
