I don't know any of the statistics or whether there are or not but I suspect there are more utches than femms or chicks. There were at Hill Crest, maybe a few more but usually just about enough to go around. If not enough butches, I suspect they'd change.

The first night I was at Hill Crest they asked me if I were fruit and I didn't know what they were talking about. They call it a queer at the house.

You wouldn't feel like doing it with a girl with an ugly face.

11-Both/ Face more so than figure. A lot of butches will take anyone they can get. But Chico and I were the only ones at Hill Crest who really looked like boys. We got the cream of ^{the} crop there, we could take out a pack and we did.

I don't rape a girl, I've never had one who didn't want it. I don't force myself on them. One of many arguments we had between us, the only reason they went with us was because we looked so much like boys. We practically had a waiting list, Chico and I. And when most of them got out they went back to going with boys.

The girl who fought with me for an hour before I got her undressed fought me because she was modest and didn't want me to see her naked, not because she didn't want it. It was ok when I got her undressed. I don't get more pleasure if I have to work with a girl. I get more pleasure if she submits easy.

If living ~~with~~ with a chick, a girl, I guess I would cook because I like to cook. I like to bake cakes. Baked at Benton County Fairs when I was a freshman. I hate sewing though but had three years of that and five years of cooking. I won a prize, first, on sponge cake.

I think they were "doing it" as well as going together. The oldest I ever knew for sure I went with was 25 . I went with her when I was 17. Oldest I ever knew who was living with another, doing it was in her 50s. She was living with a girl who was 21.

At Hillcrest, those going together, Butches and Chicks or Vots and chicks would sit around the library looking at magazines like Better Homes and Gardens just like a couple planning on getting married etc.

When we were in schools the girls would sit around and talk about artificial insemination, but I don't know of any who had it done. We talkdd about liking babies and having them, but not by men, not like by contacts with men. Butches too, but not me, talked about it. ~~Femmes too~~ Femmes too. They would not be jealous to have their partner get a bab by another man but it would be only for that purpose.

20-Religion. No. No especial interest.

21-Hill Crest, all liked to dance, but most don't know how.

Drinking, yes, likes to, but not get drunk.

At Foster home, we had whole families, mother, father, sons, daughters, cousins. We just picked them. Wouldn't hold after breakup.

At Louise home, girl wh~~o~~e short blonde hair and wore suits or fancy dresses. Tony had left there just before I came and I looked like her and this girl was lonesome. Her name was Darlene. She wanted someone to take Tony's place. I was like Tony, 15 years old. He was taller but not stronger than I. She came to my room in a silk night gown, started to kiss me. The night watchmen go down the hall, they tap on the radiator, give some kind of signal that way to others in the building. Darlene was a Butch, she really wasn't a Butch only that first night she was.

For initiation, when a new girl arrives, they see how good you are at taking jokes.

My first time with a "man," was at school, waiting for a bus. This boy was just a little older. I was wearing jeans. I wore jeans when I was a little girl. We went down the side of an incline out of sight, three of us, this boy and I and his friend who was a little older. He took down my jeans and pants but didn't take them off. That was the first time. I don't remember any feeling or anything much about it. This other boy watched us. I didn't think that funny. When he got off the other got on. I remember he said "how about it, I got it in and you didn't."

I knew what it was all about. I had been brought up on a farm and with we had horses. We had a stallion and when they brought mares there my mother wouldn't let me watch but I sneaked around and watched. Then there was an older girl, she was about 17 and the sister of the hired hand. She told me all about it and drew pictures.

The next time was when I was a freshman in high school. I was going out, sneaking out with an older boy, he was about 19 and I was 14. I climbed out the window. He had a Buick car and was the only one I knew who had a car and I didn't want to lose him. "We drove out and down a narrow little road and parked and necked. Then we got in the back seat. He fooled me to get me there. He said he wouldn't take me out any more if I didn't do it. I didn't much care and wanted to find out what it was like, but I still wrestled with him. I was wearing jeans. He got them down. I just got made that was all. There wasn't any pleasure to it, it hurt in fact. I wasn't afraid of getting pregnant because he put on a rubber. I could see him. He had the light on in the car. It wouldn't go in and he had to put vasaline on to make it go in. I don't know how long we did it. It was the only time I did it with him.

I was a freshman then and my father wouldn't let me go out.

He didn't take my jeans off. No one gets them off. He was stronger than I. I wasn't mad or didn't cry, nor think I had lost anything or anything like that. I just didn't like it. There was no sensation. I just got made.

Ken was the next. He did it two times. I was part ways drunk. There was no sensation then. I wasn't afraid of getting pregnate. It was the wrong time of the month. Besides, I can't get pregnate.

The only way I ever did it with girls was in bed, laying down, only a few times standing up. I necked them and made them want it. (indicated use of finger, large forefinger.) Indticated use of finger on all the girls, sometimes two fingers.

DD and P... They take turns... first one is Butch and then other. Both married... DD jealous. DD makes passes at girls in rest rooms etc. strangers. First time, out by garbage dump, dd made P. Funny... driving around, chasing her, catching her. Heard them at night, sl eping together, heard bed. Never wear lipstick until someone comes, rush around, putting it on. etc.

WATLOX --of either sex, persons with homosexual tendencies.

More noticeable in old days , and now, among women than men. Men brought up different way, "eliminating" tendencies.

In old days, these people accepted, no ostracism etc. just tolerated, let alone, let exist, let go their own way. Not many of them, maybe one in a thousand, usually few around, noticeable from children up, when grew up, went own way.

Women warriors were that way, went out with men on war parties, dressing like men, refused to have anything to do with men, vicious, would kill man who attempted to "rape" them strong and fighters. Two or three would live together, setting up in own tepee. Would go out hunting, fishing like men, just lived together. Any man going there and talking to them about getting married they would turn on him , fight him.

One Yakima , a great warrior, strong, brave, wouldn't have anything to do with women, thought he was like a woman at first, but those who saw him bathing said he was just like a man. He was a Pickleton Indian named Wish "ash No or Prairie Chicken. He, like the women, were powerful and strong.

Informant lived with 31 women in his day, now an old man. One of them was a Watlox but he didn't know it. She was friendly, wanted him for companion, to go to dances with, go places with, do things with, but whenever he approached her she fought, was never able to touch her.

Another : Got drunk with one "woman" who was a "atlox, but even though she was drunk she fought and bit and scratched man and he wasn't able to touch her.

Little girls: Wore war dance clothes like boys, parents paid initiation fees for them to begin dancing just like boys. At camp they were like boys, played with boys, would fight with them, little

girls wouldn't have anything to do with them, they wouldn't have anything to do with little girls, wore pants like boys while playing, going to school, danced all night long with men and boys, boys same age wouldn't have anything to do with them, older boys would, one laughing while dancing, one pretty, wore short dance outfit without "pants" other wore "pants."

Some nights showed up and wore little buckskin dresses. Moccasins boys' moccasins.

Older days "Watlox" would wear men's clothes, dance war dances with men who tolerated them, let them dance, let them alone; stood on "man's side" of long house at dances, danced there; also sat cross legged, man fashion at feasts.

One little girl in boy's dance costume went into rest room at dance, frightened women, said "~~don't~~ don't come in here, go to the other place where you belong."

DD given \$20 to pay on bills. Broke down next day, cried."I let you
down. " Gave it to P or what was left.spent it on beer with her and Jean.
Bought them eats.

DD: Worried about P going to jail . Afraid of Jean, afraid she would
take a poke at her. Said ~~she blamed~~ P blamed her for her condition.
Wanted to forget it all.

P: I'm free. Nothing to worry about now. Losing trailer house; losing
everything else. Car washed up. Getting rid of kids. Nothing to worry about.
No \$500 a month bills to meet. No having to take DD to club every
Saturday night. No this and no that.

Mother sticking by. taking care of kids, very much attached to them.
Fighting with husband. D⁻vorce filed but no final. Not pressed very
strongly. Arguing with attorney.

Day in court, sentenced to fine Made good by mother to keep her out of
jail.

Worked in car wash place. Taking off for Sunnyside on "useless" trips to confer with attorney. To Yakima to confer with. Came up with mother.

Call from DD night they were in town. "Can you come down."

Wanted to borrow car. Promised to be back in hour and one half, "we're going out to the cemetery. Mother, DD and she showed up at house, half tight on beer. Had gallon jug of beer. Drank it. Mother took off. DD and P took off. Back within few minutes of appointed time.

DD said nothing, walked through kitchen toward bedroom, slacks half unzipped. Tired, going to lay down. P too. Asked for Hamburger.

Asked for DD to come out. P talking, D silent. "Close the door then."

(Nothing said about this later.)

Sister asked: "Is she a homo."

Mother to car: My brother who is pretty smart says she's a pervert. Still no realization of their association, whatever it was.

DD determined to move. She through with P. She through. Washed up. Hurt but getting over it. "Although I will always love her." Referred to her as her first and only love.

To Yakima, located apartment, paid \$20 down on 1st 40 apt. with welfare money. Had to get out of Sunnyside. Had to have place to live, to find job. Lined up job at Bahyle.

This few weeks after cocci operation. She determined to have operation. She very much all out for Seattle girl M, phoning, keeping on phone 35 and 40 minutes. Se gal very worried, coming over weekends for her, driving her to Se and then returning her. Had to hock radio to get gas money for return. Got in with other girls. Determined to go into hospital. Made grand show for sympathy. Same at B. "There won't be any of that. Won't be any hanging around. Yet first day there lined up girls, they came around to visit, then came in "droves." Lucy, ~~Ke~~ ~~Ke~~ ~~Ke~~ strong gal, husky voice first. Poking fun at little red head. But she showed up too, hung on.

"She is just lonesome." Pat , a married gal with kids, x100 600000 divorced. Took after her. Drove red head crazy.

Expedition to Sunnyside. Looking up Marge there. Sent out word. "Important." Come back later. Arranged for M to come to Y, to move her over, which she had done. Arranged for car, arranged for setup , mixed drinks. Promised to be back by noon, was 4 before she showed with M. M. sitting, crying

No more Marge, just a friend.

"Brought her out."

D₁versions: Drive-ins . Beer drinking. Beer. Coffee at the house. Coffee pot on, custom, have it ready all the time.

At the hospital: Lots of pain. Sympathy. ressed in bed ha0000 jacket. Hopeful of calle s. Marne let her down. Sent card and note but didn't come calling.

Calls from M to hospital, could hardly make it down the hall to get to the phone. Arranged to go over and see M and "work things out." Definite now she didn't want her. She too domineering. Too much like P had been.

M: A heavy gal, intelligent, pretty logical. Had one taste of a man sh000 in midwest shen she was about 16 or so. Went to barn. "Lost her cherry but didn't really get to see what it was like because they were interrupted. "

Kids and she stayed over week nd with M. Kids drove M nuts.

Out of the hospital and home to Sunnyside, couldn't take it at home. Had to get out. Couldn't stay put. Had to chase with girls, keep injury "open." Toward end this when P and her mother came up, when D sent for him, just to have use of car, knowing mother wouldn't let P have the car.

Talk with M and weekend there , determination to get a good job, go ahead. Came back with blank books to practice bookkeeping. Never practiced. Tied into B job. Lasted there day and a half. Called for him @ @ early afternoon . Complained of sitting on chair , working, hurt operation. Complained of tension, buzzing, humming, pounding machines. Going nuts. @ @ @ Gals poured in to see how she was doing. Reveled in it. Brought beer, etc. sitting, drinking, partying. No work next day or thereafter. Finally gal , supervisor from plant called, no ified her back or else. She or elsed.

Just getting by, exis ing on visits of girlsc, coffee breaks with them. Clear sky notification from light co. Pay or else. Bills for lights ran back to time she and Pat lived at Fairview two years before, over \$33 in bills.

Clearing around. Paying little here and there on operation; regular weekly payments o on lights until they weresid off. \$3 a week. Proud of payi g out. Happy to be paid out.

Blue fancy pants and blue boots. Wanted them for night club singing events, beer hall type of night club. .

Total length of stay, two months . Nomore effort at job. C_ontent to wait for the nights and afternoonswhen girls came. C_ontent to party every weekend. Talked "red" ingo going to Portland. Accident there, washed out red's car. Going down to club.

Falked into car to go down to Pd. Other girl driving car, going down to get P.

This came about:

Late at night. Collect call. P drunk. Wanted D; want d to come for her. Broke up with Jean. Broken up.

To D's to get her to phone. Remained to babysit. She went chasing over to other girls to "work out something."

Back: Insistent P not coming back to her, insistent, she not living with her. Will live with grandmother.

Car loaned. Promised to be back by noon, Sunday because of speech.

Car ~~gassed~~ full of gas and \$15, gave her \$25, promised to keep it only in emergency. Emphasized need it for bills.

Took care of kids. No DD or P by noon, phoned mother m d-afternoon; they had just left.

Had to take taxi to speech. Farmed out kids to Thelma.

Speech . Returned at 8, not there. Went to get kids. Came home in taxi, they there. Took them home.

P moved in, bag and baggage. No effort to live with G. who did not know of her returning. Said she had no place for her anyway. Few days quiet . P mopping around. Determined to give up kids. Wasn't goin g through with divorce.

Then, borrowed G old Plymouth to go scouting for jobs. Didn't scout only one trip to Glead for cherry job. promised job June 11, not seriously lookin for work. used car and gas to get around to gaverns. Set them off for the evening.

She working with P. She entangled at same time with school teacher, physical ed, Sandy. She hot too for Kim. Kim lasted one night, one night stand, had to go get car, roust them out at daybreak to get it. Had been taking care of kids.

Same on date with Kim. P also had date or said she did. Raised gentle heck with her , looked like P was smoking her ou t because she was going out with K. K didN8t last. Out early and back early. Unexplained, never explained why ~~NOBODY~~ S did not bring her home. brought her home.

Complications. P had taken last welfare check sent to Camas and cashed it to pay on bills. This was reason she and Jean came up to break the news to D. D not evenx angry. Just appeared disgusted.

Process of changing over to Yakima or Sunnyside.

Angry with him because of shaking P down for not taking care of kids, leaving him with them while D w out and P stayed home. Defended her, bitter. "You know the score." Lectures proving aneffectual now.

Still standing by P. She is trying, hard, real hard. She has changed. She had this and that.

But, still no change in constant having to go every ight, having to hang around the taverns.

Inclination to be "alone:"

Gal Jean H., anoth r misfit, living with other girls , kicked out. Came to D and P to live a day or so, stayed four of five. They working her over. Her case on Shirley. Pursuing Shirley, a hospital girl. D telling of hearing Shirley holler one day, went into bedroom and found J nad thrown Shirley onto bed and was trying to love her. Said Shirley eas "leading her on."

S gave her talking to. Have to straighten up. Have to get job. She called up wanted to talk. Came by. Mad at Deo, bitter, classified her as young gang leader. Wouldnot make move to go home to Se on bus. I"terested in X-Ray work, interested in taking test, going through by payng being paid board and room; interested in everything, talked big like all the rest of them; interested in seeing priest; she from Catholic girl's school at San Francisco. Told of goings on there, girls and girls; little girls, up to 12 boarded one place, older ones another. She brought out by 17 or 18 year old girl when she was 12.

Did nothing when she was with girls, no cooking, left dirty dishes, no laundry, let them do up the laundry.

Liked her beer, could down four of five quarts in half a day; seemed to have to have beer. Not happy without.

Wanted to shake down girl's softball team. So many bees and same story. Orphan from Texas. Father and mother, quarreling. Mother going to divorce her father. They bringing "her girl" down to school to see her. Sure father deliberately ran into back of truck to prevent divorce. Feeling of guilt responsibility because her girl in car. Taken to hospital, she rushed there, got to be with her 15 minutes before she died.

Reading homoS books, constantly reading. Said they made her "excited," worked her up. Sitting, drinking beer, reading. Nothing bothered her.

Called herself a DSO. Diesel-Dike "I'm what is known as," wouldn't explain it.

Claimed she had never been had by a man. Claimed she was engaged. Claimed she used to get worked up but never gave ~~in~~ in. Claimed she was injured when she was 11, riding a bicycle, seat injured her. In hospital with injury. Goes through ceiling when examined by doctor. Indications "diesel-dike some kind of obstruction, mental or physical to prevent full physical contact or penetration by a man.

Decided to go to Portland to get job. Same as others. Hit the club there, got in with little blonde, young girl who had been taken over by Jean but who in turn ditched Jean.

Letters started, Jean to P, "love letters," pleading to come down.

~~PO and mother~~ P's mother came up, bringing kids. Went out on a drunk. Left kids. Bailed ~~0001~~ out. Stayed at DD's. (Account of de and her in account of night with mother.)

Mother bailed out, left kids, feuding with P who determined to turn them over to husband. Wanted only to see them occasionally. P determination.

"Men are good for only one thing. Money. Take them. Don't fall for them. Get the money from them. Don't give them anything. "

(Recall: Experience at Kennewick or Pasco. Stepping out on each other. Making each other "wild." Drunked up. Man took her to his place. She was drunk. "I was wild." Didn't know what happened to her. She came in, didn't say a thing. Found out later she came to on bed, naked and the man was on her."Almost killed me. Hurt me . Didn't know what to do."

Same thing at Portland, chasing out on each other.)

~~xRidex~~ P: Jean (P's daughter, getting old enough now. She can't grow up with that going on. I'm giving the kids up. It's going to be that way now with me. "

She and D going out separately for "one -night stanes." Feuding tempering. D gave up trip to Se with Sandra , obviously because P made her. D tried to keep it quiet from P, wanted to sneak away, but didn't.

More and more use of ~~godadda~~ grandmother's car. More and more. Keeping it at night. Had to get money to go down , rather take kids back down for closing of school.

(Mother said she brought them down, dumped them off and went on in to Portland to the club. DD unable to go, her kids sick with measles or something.

Showdown with D over the change back when she was making good and standing on her own feet. They content a few days to hang out with others, gradual tapering off with the other P whom D had associated with; gradual living in "seclusion" only when others came by to party or they used them for convenience of buying beer, transportation etc. Out to sing or try and sing at the beer joints, satisfying the ego to ~~x0~~ stand before people to entertain them, be admired by them, singing. This going back to her seduction by older man musician of some kind, when she said she was 14.

This information "volunteered" like other, like told to give excuse for her animosity or to tantillize the listener, don't know which.

Explained:

She was wild to sing, had good form good voice. ~~Had~~ ^{Had} been fighting ~~men~~ men off since she was 12, her later husband had tried to "screw men when I was 12." Hadn't any experiences with men. "Cousin or boy and I were caught in the outhouse by my mother, must have been four or five years old, just #experiementing. Didn't know what it was all about. Had another experience with cousin. Didn't say but indicated he older, indicated contact made.

I could see he didn't put on anything. It hurt me real bad. He did it two more times (didn't say specifically but indicated that) indicated might have held out.) He never thought of me, only thought of screwing me and thought of himself. Never thought of me but just thought of satisfying himself. He wanted me to leave with him.

Then there was another man before I married my husband. I went out with him and he did it to me. But I quit going with him because he seemed to think that he had to do that every time I went out with him.

"I married my husband when I was ~~17~~ 16. It was a big disappointment the first ~~1900~~ night. He didn't do it longer than 15 minutes and was all through. It was a big disappointment, I wanted it longer.

"I used to be real passionate. My husband didn't say anything to me the first night like he knew I had done it before or not. Then he started asking me, started boring in. Questioning. Jealous. To Japan. Jealous there. Came home, said someone has been here. Hadn't. Beat me. Had to run and find refuge. Beaten terrible. Scared. Came home.

"Inclination for woman on ship. Nice to me. Asked me to go to a dance.

"Never played with myself until after girl was born. Started rubbing one day. It was so complete and so good I kept on. It excites me to have a man do that with me. I do it a little and he ~~ad~~ does it a little and that makes me hot.

"Think of girls I'd like to do it with while I am doing it. Never think of men."

Only called for help when needed something to eat, cigs, or to take care of the kids. Last night went out to Selah to sing, wanted few bucks. "Only need a few bucks" to get in and buy a beer or so, then sit and wait until they ask me to sing. "

Went out with P ~~and~~ about 7 or had kids picked up then. Came home little after 10. P left car running. Always kept eye on her, came in with her, things like that. Not like J who would get up and walk out of house if she sensed there was something to be talked about a little bit.

More definite all the time. More determined to resume old ways. More sticking close together as of old. Jean started writing love letters, sending wires, phoning. D insisting she would have to "straighten her out,"

Fight between them one Saturday morning. P left to go to grandmother's, took some of her clothes, leaving D; D really upset. Called. Determined to get out of town. "Had to go someplace." "Couldn't stay." Had to go to Portland, anything to get out, indications she wanted to do ~~and~~ go down

and see J to get straightened away, but wouldn't admit it.

Went to see her at 10 a.m. on lunch hour, gave her money for beer, told her to sit tight, would be back after work, would help out as much as possible but couldn't send her out of town. Back at 3, found her sitting on the front steps, not so unhappy. Indicated she was hoping strongly P hadn't left, would call or come back. (Which she did before end of day or early evening) Result, they back together again. This was resumption of their old fights they ~~was~~ used to have. P would beat her, treated her pretty rough. Left her marked etc.

"Slain" "Wanted at Home"

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Slain Runaway Girl 'Wanted' At Home

Three days after she buried her daughter, a grieved mother tried to clear the girl's name.

The words came hard. The recounting was slow as Mrs. Albert Stevens of Willamina reminisced about better days. She struggled with memories and bad thoughts, as she tried to convey a picture of how her daughter Linda Jean really was.

Being shot to death in a coastal forest was a tragic end for a girl who had been a runaway problem almost from the time she could walk.

TWO youths, Larry West Shipely, 20, and Glen Douglas Dixon, 18, are in Lincoln County Jail, charged with the murder of Linda.

Mrs. Stevens tried to tell of the many facets of Linda Jean's home life, in her long

interview with The Journal . . . a conversation which came hard for a mother trying to forget a nightmare of events.

Though Linda Jean had been wandering away from home since she could first walk ("she used to go across the road to the neighbors, while I was hanging clothes . . . so I got one of those child harnesses, and fastened her to the line") the girl never went far.

"Usually to the top of the hill," Mrs. Stevens recounted.

"BUT she'd always come back no matter what—she wasn't afraid of us. . . . I guess she was just trying to punish us for some reason.

"We needed help for Linda Jean so we turned first to a Catholic priest who found a home for her in nearby Sher-

idan. She lived there a year and then came home.

"We thought things were quite a bit different. She had grown up a lot.

"But soon she was hanging around with the kind of people a girl of her age shouldn't. . . ."

Mrs. Stevens' voice trailed off. It sounded as though she was reaching for the courage to say what she knew she must.

"We tried our best to set our foot down and handle it right . . . we did it with all the knowledge we had."

But Linda ran off again—this time to Portland. She was returned quickly.

She blamed her difficulties on the town of Willamina. She wanted to get away from there, she declared.

IT WAS at this point—only six weeks before the end of school, that the Stevens family turned to the Yamhill

County Court for help. They asked that Linda Jean be made a ward of the court, so she could be placed in a foster home.

That's when Linda Jean went to live with Mr. and Mrs. Edward Porter of McMinnville.

But she bore no animosity toward home.

Mrs. Stevens recalled Linda Jean's last weekend with the family.

It was on July 16—she had come home for her father's birthday party. She even brought a present for him, a long-playing album of his favorite recording star, Hank Williams.

"She loved the kids," Mrs. Stevens declared. There are five other children, ranging in age from 9 months to 10 years.

"She brought each of the kids a toy car . . . She felt terribly hurt when the baby wouldn't come to her. . . .

But she hadn't seen her in a couple months, and she didn't remember."

LINDA JEAN'S winning ways, and love for her family soon overcame this. When it was time for her to return to the Porter home, she proudly demonstrated to the Porters, "see how much she loves me; see how she comes to me."

That was the last time she saw her family.

"We didn't shut her out of our home. She was free to return here anytime she wanted to call," Mrs. Stevens explained. She felt that many persons gained the impression Linda Jean was an unwanted child.

Mrs. Stevens tried with all the words at her command to demonstrate her mother's love. "We wanted to keep her . . . we love her very much," she finally managed.

SHE'S also firmly convinced that Linda Jean was not run-

ning away from home the night she slipped away to meet the two boys.

"Sure she had run away before," she explained, "but this was different. She was just out with the boys on a lark . . . she had no intention of staying away."

The heartbroken mother talked briefly about the boys accused of the murder of her daughter.

"At first I felt terribly violent toward them. But our friends in town have been so kind to us, and so many fine people held out their hands and their hearts to give us consolation, we do know there are good people in the world and that once in a while there are bad people.

"We know they've done something against the laws of the land and God, and they have got to be punished, and not let go. They can't be turned loose on the girls."

The funds voted Wednesday were not a specific sum.

with Soviet Ambassador Andrei Smirnov that West Germany must brace itself for an even bigger Berlin crisis.

Adenauer promised Smirnov he would do nothing to worsen Bonn-Moscow relations or the international situation. Smirnov was believed to have repeated earlier Soviet warnings that West Germany would be destroyed by nuclear bombs in event of war.

In an election campaign speech before 8,000 persons Wednesday night, Adenauer said Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev "continues to demand abolition of the four-power status of Berlin and a free city status for the Western part of the city."

"He also insists on separate peace treaties with the two German states," Adenauer said. "It is in negotiations on these subjects that the real crisis will break out. It may last for several months but I do not think it will lead to war."

Adenauer spoke in defense of the Western powers and rejected West German criticism of their "inactivity" with the assertion "in a real crisis the Western powers would act

The note from Soviet Col. A. S. Solovyev rejected a Western note delivered Aug. 3. This had protested the harassing tactics of the East German Communists against the East German Berliners working in West Berlin.

THERE HAS been no reply to another protest note which the Western Allies sent Tuesday to the Soviets. That note called the East German sealing of the city's borders "illegal and the most flagrant violation" of the four-power agreements on Berlin since the 1949 Soviet blockade.

The rally crowd made no attempt to conceal its dissatisfaction with what it considered slow and cautious action by the Western powers in the Berlin crisis. A poster, recalling the prewar Allied appeasement policy toward Adolf Hitler, read: "Munich 1938—Berlin 1961."

In the same vein, a group of 20 German Bonn University students have sent President Kennedy an umbrella as
