FREQUENT MISSPELLINGS-MISPRONUNCIATIONS-MISNOMERS-ETC.

- It's: <u>SEATTLE FERRY TERMINAL</u>, not Colman Dock--the old Colman Dock was torn down a few years ago and is now a part of maritime history.
- It's: T-I-L-I-K-U-M, not TILLICUM. The American Tug and Barge Company of Everett has a TILLICUM, the Indians have a Tillicum Village on Blake Island, but the 100-car ferry operating on the Seattle-Winslow route is the TILLIKUM.
- It's: <u>WASHINGTON STATE FERRIES</u>, not the Washington State Ferry System, the Washington Ferry Commission, or the Puget Sound Ferry System.
- It's: 21 vessels in the present fleet now that the KALAKALA has been sold.

 Then it will be 24 vessels when three more superferries are added early next year.
- It's: <u>S-I-D-N-E-Y</u>, British Columbia, not Sydney for our Vancouver Island destination from Anacortes and the San Juan Islands.
- It's: TA-LA-KWA (Tahlequah) for our South Vashon terminal, not TALEE-KWA.
- It's: GENERAL MANAGER -- that's the title of A. F. "Spike" Eikum, head man in the ferry system.
