





From the looks of the photo you sent of the fish fountain, the "Ladder of Life", I would say you have made progress. It is next to impossible to give any constructive criticism from a photo of this nature. To view this properly, one should slowly go around and around; to note action, composition, points of rest; and to watch for any sense of monotony, in the back ground or the fish. And last of all work should not be too realistic. This is be in bronze and should not have the appearance of being the work of a taxidermist. Watch that the base is not too symmetrical. Keep the good work up, and good luck!
