Ronald Reagan, the popular Governor of California, has agreed to speak at a Republican function in Seattle on Friday,

November 10th. This was announced today by William E. Boeing, Jr.,

Finance Chairman; Mrs. Albert Cooper, National Committeewoman;

and Ken Rogstad, King County Republican Chairman.

"We are greatly honored that Governor Reagan has accepted the invitation to visit our State," said Mrs. Cooper, "We anticipate that many citizens throughout the State will be interested in hearing him."

Governor Reagan was enthusiastically received by King
County Republicans in June of 1966 as keynote speaker at the
County Convention, immediately after winning the nomination in
California. He was invited at that time to make a return visit
to Seattle.

Governor Reagan has been mentioned more frequently in recent weeks as a potential Republican presidential nominee. A recent poll showed his popularity among voters nationwide increasing a rapidly and now among the top three, with Richard Nixon and Governor Romney of Michigan.

"We feel very fortunate in having Governor Reagan, Since this will be one of the very few out-of-state appearances he can make this year due to the press of state business in California," said Boeing.

INDIAN INTERPRETATION OF THE LORD'S PRAYER

An interpretation of The Lord's Prayer in the Plains Indian sign language will be a special highlight of the final session of the Fifteenth Annual Republican Woman's Conference on Thursday, October 26 in Denver, Colorado.

Dressed in colorful beaded native attire, Mrs. Ferale Pease, a Crow

Indian from Fort Washakie, Wyoming, will appear before women conference delegates

from 13 Western States, during a luncheon session scheduled for 12 noon in the

Denver Hilton Hotel.

Born and raised on the Crow Reservation, Mrs. Pease graduated from Lodge Gross High School in Montana, attended Business College in Bollinger, Montana and has worked with several branches of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, serving the Crow, Shoshone, Blackfoot and Arapahoe Tribes.

Assistant Republican National Chairman Mary Brooks, a state Senator from Idaho, will preside at the Republican Women's Western Conference, which has just completed special sessions in Chicago, Little Rock, and Boston, launching a nationwide "Involvement Program" for GOP women.

The Denver meeting will feature Senator John Tower of Texas as a major speaker and will set into motion a stepped-up action program to stimulate recruitment, training and leadership activities for Republican women throughout the country.
