Actually, our All Indian Rodeo, celebrating its tenth year, is not new to this country. Many horse round-ups and horse races were held here by the Indians during the past 80 years, well at-tended by visiting Indians who came to this valley to work in the fruit orchards, farms and hop yards. But, it is probably the first all Indian rodeo ever sponsored by an association of Indians in the State of Washington. **Nine** years ago it started with a dream, soon became reality with the help of a comparatively few enthusiastic men and women, and now our rodeo has been well established as an annual community affair. It is self-supporting and operates on a non-profit basis. Much work is volunteered and this has.

no doubt, contributed greatly to the progress we have made. During these eight years we have had the dependable help of Johnny Van Belle with his lusty bucking horses, the fatherly support of the Tribal Council, and the kindly backing of the community, the merchants of the valley, the American Legion of White Swan, and all the Indian organizations — The Klickitat and Logey Creek Cattle Associations, the Wigwam Club of White Swan, The American Legion Auxiliary, and the Reservation Improvement Club.

Deep gratitude and thanks to all who have contributed in the past and present to the continued success of our Rodeo.
