

Harrington, a town in the southeastern part of Lincoln county. In 1882 W.P. Harrington, a banker in Colusa, California, invested in lands in Lincoln County. The townsite was owned by Horace Cutter and others. Mrs. Cutter, a close friend of Harringtons had the honor of naming the town. A few years later, the California Land and Stock Company was organized with the late Jacob Furth of Seattle as president; W.P. Harrington, vice-president ; Dr. Luke Robinson of San Francisco, treasurer; and John J. Green, manager. Mr. Harrington remained a member of the company until his death in 1903. (H.S. Bassett in Names MSS Letter 327)
