In reference to the above noted matter and others closely
pertaining:

I shall be most happy to make comments in connection with
Case No. 222, asserting an aboriginal occupancy claim on behalf of the
Palouse Band of Indians.

It so happens that in past years I made a considerable study
of the "Palouse", about whom little has been gathered and scarcely anything
published.

I am hopeful that the material will prove beneficial to
your legal staff, and ethnologists who are assisting you. Offhand I should
say it will run 30 to 60 pps. and I will have the girl who typed my
manuscript, type three copies, 1 for my own retention, and two to be sent
to you. It will contain a good deal of historical background and I believe
numerous "leads". I would estimate that this will be ready in a week,
the typist's time delaying it.

My visit to the Umatilla and Colville reservations has been
completed and side trips made to noteworthy archive collections.
Material on that will also be forthcoming.
