BOOK LIST NO. 4 - "FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY"

The response to previous lists has been excellent. Practically all of the books listed have been placed in our library by "Friends".

All that is necessary is to check the book you would like to give to our Library and enclose the necessary check. If your book has been taken previously, we'll secure some other book we need.

Our Library is growing. It is adding needed books on the Northwest. Much of this advance is due to cooperation of "Friends of the Library". Your book will be properly labeled in your name, and you will receive a certificate of membership in "Friends of the Library". Several have given us valuable Northwest books which they need no longer. That also qualifies you for membership.

"A TEEPEE IN HIS FRONT YARD" - Dr. Clifford M. Drury \$ 3.00
This is the story of the founding of Spokane by the author who did so much for Whitman and Spalding. The book is important and interesting. We need it.

"THE COLUMBIA" - Murray Morgan 3.50
The first comprehensive book to be written about the Columbia, - truly a river of destiny. The Columbia will play a major role in world affairs. Morgan tells the story of the world's most publicized body of water. This book should be in our library.

"PACIFIC CREST TRAILS" - Joseph T. Hazard 3.50
The author of this book knows the backbone of our Continent from Alaska to Cape Horn. These mountain ridges had a lot to do with the settlement of the West. There is much "guide" material in it.

"GOLD RUSH ALBUM" - Joseph Henry Jackson 10.00
Jackson tells the whole story of the Gold Rush in one volume, profusely illustrated with hundreds of first-hand pictures, 47 produced for the first time. The gold rush to California indirectly affected the Northwest greatly. A book every library should have, including ours.

"THE TRAIL LED NORTH" - Martha McKeown 3.50
The story of Mount Hawthorne. The author is a third-generation Oregonian, an acknowledged authority on the early history of the Northwest. A vivid tale of the Northwest by one of the actors. An authentic narrative of the Alaska gold rush days. A tale of the North that ties in closely with the history of Washington.

"THE BATTLE FOR NORTH AMERICA" - John Tebbel 7.50
The author has edited into one volume the works of Francis Parkman on this subject. The Northwest was sought by Spain, England, France, Russia. We need to know all we can of the Northwest background. There is a lot of it in this volume.

- "THE WOLF AND THE RAVEN" - Viola E. Garfield and Linn A. Forrest \$ 3.00
Totem poles have attracted the attention and aroused the curiosity of all who have seen them. They are produced nowhere else in the world. This book reveals much of the social structure, hardships and general philosophy of life of the Northwest Indians.
- "THAT MAN THOMPSON" - R. H. Thompson 2.50
At the age of 92, R. H. Thompson is able to look back over 67 years of growth of Seattle, from a town of 5,000 in 1881 to half a million today. He had a great deal to do with the development of Seattle, serving for many years as city engineer. One of the most important Seattle books.
- "LEWIS & CLARK, PARTNERS IN DISCOVERY" - Bakeless 5.00
Impossible to know too much about the men who conducted the most extensive land exploration job in the world's history. This book should be in our library.
- "DOWN THE RIVER OF NO RETURN" - Robert G. Bailey 3.00
Early history and development, Indian wars, customs, legends; life in Salmon River country. Interesting background of Northwest history. The author has developed a very accurate book which we need.
