ELECTION DATES: STATE PRIMARY: September 14, 1954
STATE GENERAL ELECTION: November 2, 1954.

FILING PERIOD: JULY 1ST TO JULY 20TH, INCLUSIVE
(Candidates cannot withdraw after July 26th.)

NOTE: 1953 Legislature established new filing period for precinct committeeman by continuing filing period to and including 7th day after state primary. Thus filing period for precinct committeeman in 1954 is set as: July 1st to September 21st, inclusive. (Position is not subject to state primary and is voted upon only at state general election.)

DECLARATIONS FILED:

1. With Secretary of State:

For Congressional and state offices. Also positions of State Senator and State Representative when legislative district comprises more than one county.

2. With County Auditor:

For all positions voted upon wholly within a single county.

FILING FEES: One percent of annual salary of position sought with minimum fee set as \$10.00. Filing fee for precinct committeeman set at \$1.00.
