Indian Agent and labelled "Bids for Stock Cattle," up to 12 o'clock m. on Friday, July 15th, for the purchase of 500 head of cattle—more or less. Bids must be in writing, delivered at the Office of the U. S. Indian Agent at or before the time above specified and accompanied by a certified check on some National Bank for not less than 10 per cent. of the gross amount of the bid; said check to be payable to the order of the U. S. Indian Agent.

The cattle will be close herded, for inspection of bidders, for at least five (5) days previous to the day of sale.

Terms of Sale—Cash before delivery. Cattle to be removed within ten (10) days after notice of the acceptance of bid. Any and all bids to be rejected if deemed for the best interests of the Government, and sale to be ratified by the Hon. Secretary of the Interior.

## Extract from Act of Congress Approved June 20, 1878.

"That hereafter all advertisements, notices, proposals for contracts, and all forms of advertising required by law for the several departments of the Government may be paid for at a price not to exceed the commercial rates charged to private individuals, with the usual discounts; such rates to be ascertained from sworn statements to be furnished by the proprietors or publishers of the newspapers proposing so to advertise."


