

CHIEF JOSEPH DAYS is chock-full of good times—parades, rodeos, ceremonial Indian dances, dancing, outdoor breakfasts and a host of other things right up in the beautiful alpine splendor of the Wallowa Mountains.



It's worth coming to Wallowa County if for no other reason than to see the beautifully scenic country on

the way. From La Grande take state highway 82, or if you are driving from Walla Walla or Pendleton areas, take state highway 204 just a mile out of Weston to Elgin where you connect with No. 82. If you're coming from the Lewiston area, take Washington State Highway No. 3 which meets Oregon State Highway No. 3 to bring

you into the county.

If you want to fly in, the Joseph Municipal Airport

is only a half mile west of town.

Bus lines connect with all points via La Grande.

Now is the time to start planning a visit to Wallowa County where the sheer grandeur of the Wallowa Mountains, known as the Alps of America, beautiful valleys made lush by abundant irrigation water and the tremendous canyon country add enchantment to this out-of-the-way area.

There are good restaurants and accommodations, roads leading to many of the scenic spots of the county and dependable licensed guides to take you fishing or camping in the high mountains.

Incomparable Wallowa Lake, formed over a million years ago, lies a scant half-mile south of Joseph. The lake is over six miles long, a mile wide, over 280 feet deep and there are rainbow, mackinaw and kokanee (land-locked salmon) stocked in it by the state game

At the head of the lake are many cabins, inns, lodges and Wallowa Lake State Park with parking space for hundreds of campers and trailer house vacationers.

There are "trips to take" and "places to see" you'll remember all your life, such as Hat Point, where you look three miles down into the Snake River Canyon. A drive to Buckhorn Springs in the northern part of the county for a panoramic view of the Imnaha and Snake River country will leave you breathless with awe

Drive up Hurricane Creek or the Lostine River Canyon for a picnic at one of the forest service camps, or take "the loop" from Joseph to Imnaha.

The most Northeastern town in Oregon is Imnaha, the western gateway to Hell's Canyon of the Snake River. There are three roads out of Imnaha (elevation 1945 ft.), one to the east (a dead end) to Hat Point Guard Station (elevation 7,982 feet) overlooking Hell's Canyon, one to the north (a dead end) hitting the Snake River at Dug Bar (elevation 1,005 feet) some 20 or 30 miles below Hell's Canyon and one to the south over the mountains to Halfway and/or Baker, Oregon.

Winters are mild at Imnaha but only the Dug Bar Road can be traveled to its end in the winter. From mid June until mid November is the best time to visit the higher elevations. The fishing is excellent and there are plenty of deer, elk and chukars. There is a grocery store and tavern, a hardware store, garage and cafe to take care of all your needs.

There are dozens of trips to take in your car and there are dozens of forest service trails leading into the Eagle Cap Primitive Area for hikers and for pack trips. There are no cars or trucks here—not even an outboard motor to break the stillness of this vast wonderland!

For the sportsman there's fishing in the high lakes of the Wallowas that is afforded only rarely these days.

Added to all this scenic beauty you'll find real, honest-to-goodness hospitality in Wallowa County where the residents are glad to answer your questions as to where to go and what to see. This is not "tourist" country. You and your family will feel more like what you really are-honored guests!

The days are warm and inviting, the nights cool. You'll want warm serviceable clothing from head to toe. There's swiming, boating, horseback riding, dancing, golfing, bowling and plain lazying around to do in Wallowa County!
