Even that that it could have been

put out for #3.75 and ould have been the same as a \$6.50 or \*8.00 book now days. However unless you know all the ropes, printers price you(and themselves right out of the market.) The place does top work too, even for magazines all over the coast, real superior color work etc. But they should, having "leased" our "uro ean presses etc. a few years ago, brand new equipment from England, Germany etc. So, if in the future you ever get into a smaller pamphlet type of publication, keep it in mind (and my mailing list too).

you will note the type is just a bit sell (stendard newspaper face) and few little things like that, but by adding just a bit more some of the worst defects, which might of be that, can be overcome.

by all means write me your reaction when you get a chance to skim through "Strangers." And again, I'll appreciate you contacting the Wenatchee book store or mailing one of the sheets to them, etc.

Again, thebest of luck on "Moses."
